Overview

Bone morphogenetic proteins (BMPs) are critical for the formation of cartilage and its conversion into bone.

The Invention

UW-Madison researchers have developed DNA clones, antibodies, vectors and cell lines for expressing bone morphogenetic protein-1 (BMP-1). These materials can be used to produce recombinant BMP-1.

Applications

- Detecting BMP-1 protein and RNA

Key Benefits

- Potentially useful in high throughput screening for inhibitors of BMP-1
- May be used in X-ray crystallography prior to drug design
